

## PRINCIPALS NEWS...

The school values of *Respect, Responsibility, Integrity and Safety*, are intrinsically connected to the questions we ask in the school climate survey. At the end of last term, our Grade 6 Leaders assisted in surveying students and parents on our school climate. Last week, the same students, with guidance, analysed the results of this survey. They noted that **overall the school has a very positive climate** with both student and parent responses being closely aligned. We also identified three areas to further develop. Our goals were developed in the form of inquiry questions. This provides students, teachers and parents a way to collaboratively make our School Climate even better. The inquiry questions are:

- **How to develop positive resolutions to problems in the playground?**
- **How to provide a learning environment with minimal disruptions?**
- **How to create an environment where there is respectful relationship and language?**

Our teachers and students are collaborating both in the class and through the SRC in developing ways to address the above inquiry questions.

How to develop positive resolutions to problems in the playground?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Report to class teacher any incidents and concerns your child shares at home.</li> <li>• Have a conversation with your child(ren) about never resolving problems with physical aggression.</li> <li>• Encourage your child(ren) to tell the teacher of difficulties they are having with others.</li> <li>• Ask Positive Questions:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Share with me three good things that happened today.</li> <li>○ Share with me something you enjoyed in your learning.</li> <li>○ Is there anything else you would like to share?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
How to provide a learning environment with minimal disruptions?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remind your child to make good decisions.</li> <li>• Make sure children have a good night's sleep.</li> <li>• Consider turning off technology at least an hour before bed.</li> <li>• Reinforce expectations of "doing your very best at school."</li> <li>• Eat a healthy breakfast.</li> </ul>
How to create an environment where there is respectful relationship and language?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Talk to students about big teasing and small teasing.</li> <li>• Reinforce strategies of ignoring, using humour and telling a teacher.</li> <li>• Teach children that swearing is not acceptable language.</li> <li>• Report to classroom teacher if their child is having difficulty.</li> <li>• Model appropriate behaviours.</li> </ul>

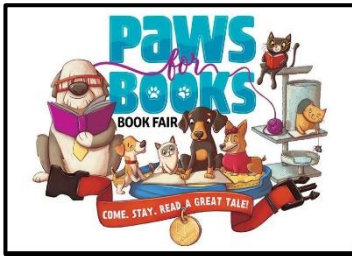
